Squatters' rights exist in various forms across the United States, including Pennsylvania. There are cases where evicting squatters from your property can become a very difficult and costly problem, and the number of these cases is on the rise. With squatting becoming more common, it never hurts to be prepared.

Here are a few practical tips to prevent squatters from moving into your property:

- Put 'No Trespassing' signs on structures and out buildings that are not frequented and at any of your vacant properties. This makes a clear legal statement that gives law enforcement the authority to detain and remove anyone who doesn't belong there.
- Make sure all buildings are physically secure by locking the doors, windows and access points. (A trespasser is one who forces entry. If a potential squatter breaks in, it may help if they can also be considered a trespasser)
- Adequate lighting and security systems help deter unauthorized entry.
- Be aware of activity on your property, regularly inspect your property and encourage neighbors to report any suspicious activity.
- Did we mention...<u>post "No Trespassing" signs</u> on the property, and document it with a photo!!! This is to help protect your right to have squatters evicted under Criminal Trespass and is the number one way to protect your rights.
- The safest approach to evict squatters is to contact local law enforcement immediately to let them handle the situation.
